Using *Wyatt the Wonder Dog* to Teach Interpersonal Skills and the "I Statement"

Objectives:

- Students will learn the 'I statement' for interacting with others
- Students will learn how to manage conflicts with peers
- Students will learn basic social skills: sharing, taking turns, listening, saying please and thank you

- Courtesy

Essential Questions: How can you handle friendship problems? What is the best way to ask a bossy friend to change their behavior? What is the "I Statement" and when should it be used?

Lesson

- Discuss friendship with students: What makes a good friend? What are some of the characteristics of a good friend? What are some characteristics of a bossy and inconsiderate friend?
- Make a list of ways to handle a bossy friend. How have students dealt with this problem?
- Read Wyatt the Wonder Dog Learns About Good Manners. Answer the discussion questions.
- Use the Practice What Wyatt Learned Worksheet. Have students make up their own conflict problem and role play, using the 'I Statement'
- Complete the *What Makes a Good Friend?* Worksheet
- Complete the *Conflict Resolution* Worksheet.
- Make some Wyatt puppy dog ears to wear!






Make a Wyatt Disguise
